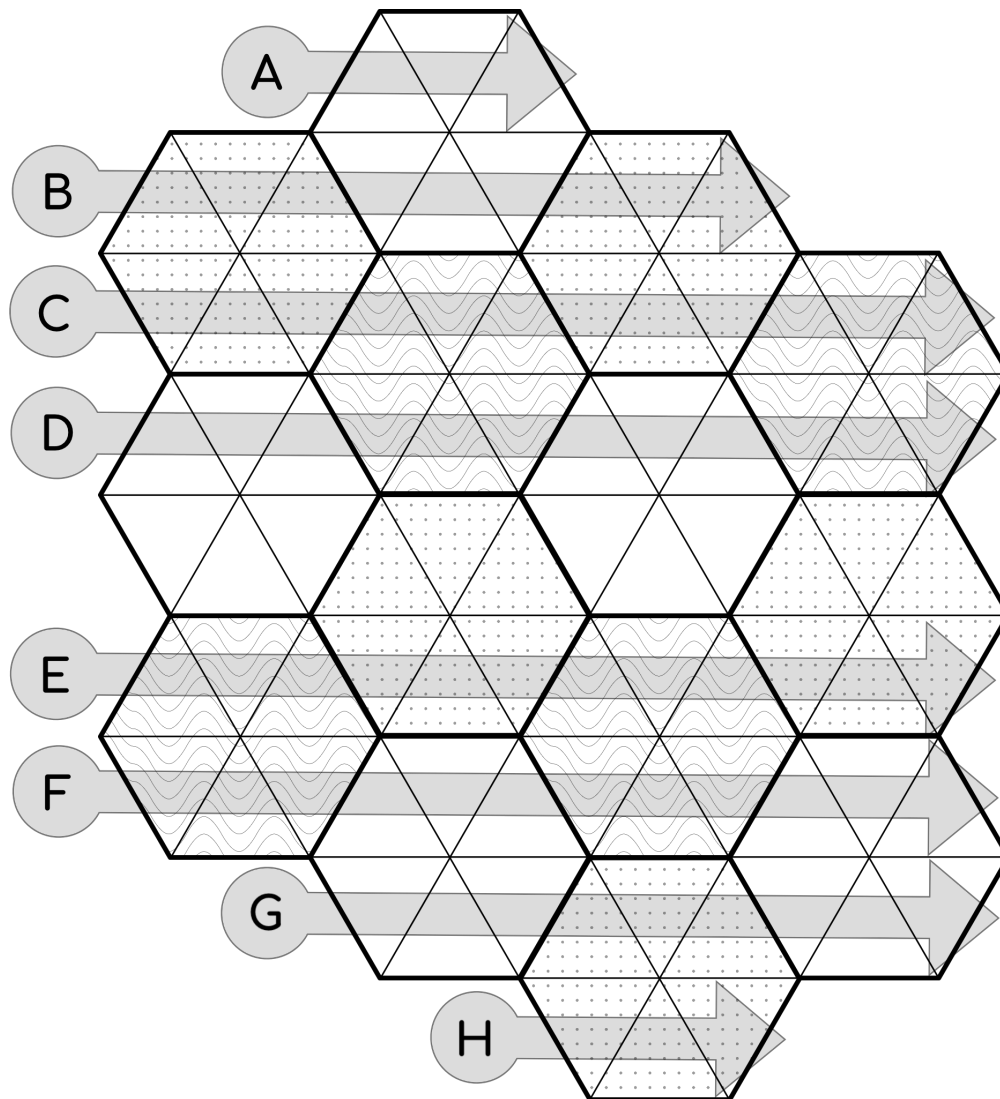


Mrs. Prunetree hopes to add something new to the Home's vegetable garden.



How Does a Rows Garden Puzzle Work?

“Rows Gardens” are crossword-like puzzles. One letter is written in each triangle. The answers to the “arrows” clues read straight across the corresponding arrows, just the way you’d expect. (If there are multiple clues for a row, they are given in order from left to right.) But one of these rows doesn’t have any arrow, or any clues...

The “bloom” clues are trickier. Each hexagon contains a six-letter word, but that word may be written clockwise or counterclockwise, and it may start on any of the six triangles! The clues for each group of blooms are given in alphabetical order by answer.

Arrows

- A. Alma mater of Borges biographer Alicia Jurado
- B. Fictional traitor to Charlemagne
Club with access to aux cords
- C. Famed trilingual stone from 196 BC
Virtual hotel established in 2000
- D. Son of Malory on *Archer*
Guinness of *The Ladykillers*
- E. Rot, decompose, producing a fetid smell
Mother of Huey, Dewey, and Louie
- F. Affectation of Abraham Lincoln, Ned Kelly, Haile Selassie, and Santa Claus
Roiled and bubbled with anger
- G. Stygian, caliginous, black as coal
"Honi soit qui mal y pense," e.g.
- H. Cops who outrank Sgts

- Papi's papi
- Imbibes

- Nobel founder Sohlman
- The stroke of the hour (2 words)

Dotted Blooms

- Birthplace of Camila Cabello (and Trix Febrero)
- Predominantly
- Bids
- Spleens and stomachs and gallbladders
- Pallid or yellowish in complexion

Wavy Blooms

- Rain blows upon (2 words)
- Fashion brogues or espadrilles
- Kitten delivery
- Tossed far away, in Zoomer parlance
